### **RECOMMENDATION(S):**

Approve and authorize the Health Services Director, or his designee, to execute, on behalf of the County, Contract #74-475-53 with Ryann De Souza, MFT, an individual, in an amount not to exceed \$120,000, to provide Medi-Cal specialty mental health services for the period from November 1, 2016 through June 30, 2018.

### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

This Contract is funded 50% Federal Medi-Cal and 50% State General Fund.

## **BACKGROUND:**

On January 14, 1997, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution #97/17, authorizing the Health Services Director to contract with the State Department of Mental Health, (now known as the Department of Health Care Services) to assume responsibility for Medi-Cal specialty mental health services. Responsibility for outpatient specialty mental health services involves contracts with individual, group and organizational providers to deliver these services.

Under Contract #74-475-53, the Contractor will provide Medi-Cal specialty mental health
