Subject: Human Trafficking Advocacy Program Grant Award for the Period October 1, 2016 through September 30, 2017

RECOMMENDATION(S):

ADOPT Resolution No. 2016/667 approving and authorizing the District Attorney, or designee, to submit an application and execute a grant award agreement, and any amendments or extensions thereof, pursuant to State guidelines, with the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services, Criminal Justice/Emergency Management & Victim Services Branch, for funding of the Human Trafficking Advocacy Program in the amount of \$50,000 for the period October 1, 2016 through September 30, 2017.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The District Attorney will receive \$50,000 of additional revenues. This grant requires a match of \$12,500 which will be met with an in-kind match.

BACKGROUND:

The District Attorney is seeking to apply for grant funds that will focus on identifying and assisting victims of human trafficking. The Human Trafficking Advocacy Program grant will fund a half time victim advocate to provide critically important services to victims of
