FISCAL IMPACT:

The project is funded 90% California Department of Water Resources Local Levee Critical Repair Program Funds and 10% Contra Costa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Funds.

BACKGROUND:

The Contra Costa County (County) Public Works Department is required to obtain an encroachment permit from EBRPD for the San Pablo and Wildcat Creeks Levee Remediation Project, in order to construct levee berm improvements that straddle EBRPD's and Contra Costa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District's (Flood Control) property in the North Richmond area.

(FEMA) Freeboard requirements. Upon completion and acceptance of the project, these areas will be excluded from the FEMA Flood Zone Map and residents will not be required to purchase flood insurance.
