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**RECOMMENDATION(S):**

Approve and authorize the Health Services Director, or his designee, to execute, on behalf of the County, Interagency Agreement #28–329-1 with Pittsburg Unified School District, a government agency, to provide school-based mobile clinic services, for the period from March 1, 2017 through August 31, 2020.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

This is a non-financial agreement.

**BACKGROUND:**

This Contract meets the social needs of County's population by providing mobile clinic services, including comprehensive physical exams, immunizations, TB testing, sports physicals, and well-child care to low-income and disadvantaged school children at Parkside Elementary School, Heights Elementary School, Marina Vista Elementary School, and Pittsburg High School. Under Interagency Agreement #28–329-1, County will provide school-based mobile clinic services to children within the Pittsburg Unified School District ("District"), through August 31, 2020.
