#### **BACKGROUND:**

Health Services Department will use Contractor's Meaningful Use Quality Manager and CareDiscovery Quality Measures applications to meet reporting requirements including The Joint Commission (TJC) electronic quality reporting options, and E measures that meets The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) reporting requirements. Truven provides an integrated application that supports Federal reporting requirements to meet Meaningful Use guidelines. This tool is already in place with our Epic (ccLink) system.
