Subject: Continue Extension of Emergency Declaration Regarding Homelessness

RECOMMENDATION(S):

CONTINUE the emergency action originally taken by the Board of Supervisors on November 16, 1999 regarding the issue of homelessness in Contra Costa County.

BACKGROUND:

On November 16, 1999, the Board of Supervisors declared a local emergency, pursuant to the provisions of Government Code Section 8630 on homelessness in Contra Costa County.

Government Code Section 8630 requires that, for a body that meets weekly, the need to continue the emergency declaration be reviewed at least every 14 days until the local emergency is terminated. In no event is the review to take place more than 21 days after the previous review. On August 15, 2017 the Board of Supervisors reviewed and approved the emergency declaration. Since the Board has not met since August 15th and the next available Board meeting is September 12, 2017, the time between board orders exceeded 21 days.
