## FISCAL IMPACT:

100% funding is included in the Hospital Enterprise Fund I budget. The equipment is estimated to pay for itself within three years due to the reduction of injuries and lost work hours.

## **BACKGROUND:**

Hovertech International provides hovermatts, hovermatt slings, and other products for moving patients. The use of these products is now mandated by law in order to reduce the possibility of injuries to staff while moving patients. The first year trial was so successful
