Subject: Tobacco Law Enforcement Grant

RECOMMENDATION(S):

ADOPT Resolution No. 2018/129 approving and authorizing the Sheriff-Coroner or designee, to apply for and accept the Office of the Attorney General, California Department of Justice, Division of Law Enforcement Tobacco Law Enforcement Grant Program in an amount not to exceed \$97,100 for law enforcement operations to decrease juvenile access and use of tobacco products for the period June 1, 2018 through June 30, 2020.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Initial Revenue of \$97,100; 100% State funds.

BACKGROUND:

The Office of the Attorney General, California Department of Justice, Division of Law Enforcement Tobacco Law Enforcement Grant Program is providing funding to apply strategies that reduce illegal sales and marketing of all tobacco products to minors. According to California Healthy Kids Survey, Contra Costa County 2016 data, thirty-two percent of 11th graders and twenty percent of 9th graders reported that it is "very easy" to obtain tobacco products within Contra Costa County. Beginning July 1, 2018 the Office of the Sheriff will conduct various enforcement operations and prevention projects in order to
