The Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC), as the regional transportation planning agency for the San Francisco Bay region, has adopted MTC Resolution No. 4108 which supersedes MTC Resolution No. 875, Revised, commencing with the Fiscal Year 2014/2015 funding cycle. Resolution No. 4108 delineates procedures and criteria for submission of requests for the allocation of TDA Article 3 funds. Each claimant whose project or projects have been prioritized for inclusion in the Fiscal Year 2018/2019 TDA Article 3 countywide coordinated claim is required to submit a resolution from its governing body to MTC requesting an allocation of TDA Article 3 funds.

CONSEQUENCE OF NEGATIVE ACTION:
