Subject: 2018-19 Calif. Dept. of Educ. Alternative Payment Childcare Services Revenue Contract

RECOMMENDATION(S):

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Employment & Human Services Department Director, or designee, to execute a revenue agreement in the amount of \$1,516,260 from the California Department of Education for alternative payment childcare programs operated by the County with term July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This agreement is funded by the California Department of Education and no County match is required. The State funding number is CAPP 8010; the County number is 29-212-32.

56% (\$854,445) of the funding is a Federal pass through with CFDA # 93.596 and 44% (\$661,815) of the funding is State funded. The federal funds are passed through the State through the Department of Education.

BACKGROUND:

The Department was notified by California Department of Education on June 13, 2017 of the County's 2017-18 allocation for the Alternative Payment childcare services program.

BACKGROUND: (CONT'D)

The Alternative Payment childcare services program provides funding for program eligible families to receive services. Priority is given to families who interface with Child Protective Services, families with children at-risk of abuse and neglect, low-income families, and families with children who have special needs. Approval of this board order will allow the continued provision of these childcare services.

CONSEQUENCE OF NEGATIVE ACTION:

If not approved, County will not receive funding to operate this childcare program.
