Subject: Contract #23-573-4 with Center for Human Development

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**RECOMMENDATION(S):**

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Health Services Director, or designee, to execute on behalf of the County, Contract #23-573-4 with Center for Human Development, a non-profit corporation, in an amount not to exceed \$1,040,194, to provide social need resource linkage, prison and jail reentry support services, health education and community outreach services to patients and residents of Contra Costa County, for the period July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

This contract is funded 19% by Medi-Cal Administration Activities and 81% by Health Services Ambulatory Care. (Rate increase)

**BACKGROUND:**

On June 6, 2017, the Board of Supervisors approved Contract #23-573-3 with Center for Human Development, to provide social need resource linkage, prison and jail reentry support services, health education and community outreach services to patients and residents of Contra Costa County, for the period July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018.
