## **FISCAL IMPACT:**


This agreement reimburses the Department for all associated costs incurred for the implementation of the Pierce's Disease Control Program in an amount not to exceed \$398,304. There is no match of County funds nor grant monies involved. This revenue has been included in the FY18/19 budget.

## **BACKGROUND:**

The County's Department of Agriculture deploys traps, inspects incoming nursery shipments, landscaping and host crops countywide to detect incipient infestations of Glassy-winged Sharpshooter (GWSS). Any population of GWSS detected is delimited and controlled or eradicated. The CDFA, reimburses the Department for all costs, not to exceed \$398,304 for this program. Pierce's Disease and its vectors are a clear and present danger to
