Subject: Grant Agreement #28-374 with the Office of Statewide Health Planning & Development

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**RECOMMENDATION(S):**

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Health Services Director, or designee, to execute on behalf of the County, Grant Agreement #28-374 (#17-82372) with the Office of Statewide Health Planning & Development (OSHDP) to pay the County an amount not to exceed \$15,000 including agreeing to indemnify OSHDP, for the Health Careers Training Program (HCTP) in Central Contra Costa County, for the period from July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

This agreement will result in up to \$15,000 of funding for the HCTP Project. No County match required.

**BACKGROUND:**

Health disparities are associated with poor education outcomes, residents face disproportionate rates of preventable chronic illness such as heart disease, obesity, and cancer. The HCTP aims to continue efforts to advance health career pathways and youth professional development in a community most impacted by health inequities. Project goals include: 1) facilitate curriculum to at least 50 Mt. Diablo High School students focused on
