Subject: APPROVE a purchase order amendment with Cal Steam, Inc.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Purchasing Agent to execute, on behalf of the Public Works Director, a purchase order amendment with Cal Steam, Inc., to increase the payment limit by \$155,000, to a new payment limit of \$250,000, and to extend the termination date from September 30, 2019, to September 30, 2020, for plumbing parts and equipment, Countywide.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This cost is to be funded through the Public Works Department Facilities Maintenance Services budget. (100% General Fund)

BACKGROUND:

The Public Works Department Facilities Services Maintenance conducted a Bidsync bid soliciting a vendor for plumbing parts and equipment. These parts are typically items used in plumbing repairs and improvements. Posted as Bidsync Bid # 1705-226, Cal Steam, General Plumbing and Heieck Supply were awarded this commodity.
