Subject: Unserved/Underserved Victim Advocacy and Outreach (UV) Program 2018/19

RECOMMENDATION(S):

ADOPT Resolution No. 2018/470 approving and authorizing the District Attorney, or designee, to submit an application and execute a grant award agreement, including any extensions or amendments thereof, pursuant to State guidelines, with the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES), Victim Services & Public Safety Branch, in an amount not to exceed \$ 175,000, for funding of the Unserved/Underserved Victim Advocacy and Outreach (UV) Program for the period October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The District Attorney will receive up to \$175,000 to fund victim advocacy staff to provide better services to underserved populations in targeted areas. The funding requires a 25% match, which will be met with services provided by the Richmond, Pittsburg, Oakley Police Departments and West County Family Justice Center.

BACKGROUND:

The Unserved/Underserved Victim Advocacy and Outreach (UV) Program is supported by Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Victim Assistance and is authorized by the Victims of Crime
