RECOMMENDATION(S):

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Health Services Director, or designee, to execute on behalf of the County, Contract #74–106–19 with Adolescent Treatment Centers, Inc. (dba Thunder Road), a non-profit corporation, in an amount not to exceed \$200,000 to provide mental health services for Seriously Emotionally Disturbed (SED) adolescents with substance abuse issues and mental health challenges at its Thunder Road facility for the period from July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This contract is funded 50% by Federal Medi-Cal and 50% by Mental Health Realignment funds. (Rate increase)

BACKGROUND:

This contract meets the social needs of County's population by providing mental health services to adolescents with emotional and behavioral problems to improve school performance, reduce unsafe behavioral practices, and reduce the need for out-of-home placements.
