Subject: Novation Contract #74-309-2 with Amador Institute, Inc.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Health Services Director, or designee, to execute on behalf of the County, Novation Contract #74-309-2 with Amador Institute, Inc., a non-profit corporation, in an amount not to exceed \$283,250 to provide mental health services for Seriously Emotionally Disturbed (SED) adults, adolescents and latency-aged children in East and Central Contra Costa County, for the period July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019, and includes a six-month automatic extension through December 31, 2019, in an amount not to exceed \$141,625.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This contract is funded 50% by Federal Medi-Cal and 50% by Mental Health Realignment funds.

BACKGROUND:

This contract meets the social needs of County's population by providing mental health services for Seriously Emotionally Disturbed (SED) adults, adolescents and latency-aged children.

On March 23, 2017, the Board of Supervisors approved Novation Contract #74-309-1 with

Amador Institute, Inc. to provide mental health, case management and crisis intervention services to SED adults, adolescents and latency-age children in East and Central Contra Costa County, through June 30, 2018, including a six-month automatic extension through December 31, 2018.

BACKGROUND: (CONT'D)

Approval of Novation Contract #74-309-2 replaces the automatic extension under the prior contract and allows the contractor to continue providing mental health services through June 30, 2019.

CONSEQUENCE OF NEGATIVE ACTION:

If this contract is not approved, SED adults, adolescents and latency-aged children will not receive mental health services.

CHILDREN'S IMPACT STATEMENT:

This program supports the following Board of Supervisors' community outcomes: "Children Ready For and Succeeding in School"; "Families that are Safe, Stable, and Nurturing"; and "Communities that are Safe and Provide a High Quality of Life for Children and Families".
