RECOMMENDATION(S):

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Employment & Human Services Director, or designee, to execute an inter-agency agreement with Mount Diablo Unified School District in an amount not to exceed \$206,328 to provide Early Head Start Program Enhancement services for the period October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This agreement is funded by federal funds through the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Children and Families, CFDA No. 93.600. There is no County match requirement.

BACKGROUND:

Contra Costa County receives funds from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Children and Families (ACF) to provide Head Start and Early Head Start program services to program eligible County residents. The Department of Employment and Human Services (Department), in turn, contracts with a number of community-based organizations to provide a wider distribution of services. This
