Subject: POST Driving Simulator and Force Option Contract

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**RECOMMENDATION(S):**

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Sheriff-Coroner, or designee, to execute a contract with the California Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training, including full indemnification of the State of California, to pay the County an initial allocation of \$44,000 for the instruction of accredited Driving Simulator and Force Option Simulator courses for the period July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

No County Costs. \$44,000; 100% Revenue, State of California. Budgeted in fiscal year 2019/20.

**BACKGROUND:**

The Office of the Sheriff - Law Enforcement Training Center provides the California Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST), approved driving simulator and force option simulator instruction to law enforcement personnel in order to ensure up-to-date training. This contract will enable the Sheriff's Office to recover the costs of this instruction for an initial count of up to 400 students.
