Subject: Contract Amendment Agreement #25-079-2 with Portia Bell Hume Behavioral Health and Training Center

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**RECOMMENDATION(S):**

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Health Services Director, or designee, to execute on behalf of the County Contract Amendment Agreement #25-079-2 with Portia Bell Hume Behavioral Health and Training Center, a corporation, effective May 1, 2019, to amend Contract #25-079-1, to increase the payment limit by \$10,000, from \$100,000 to a new payment limit of \$110,000, with no change in the term of October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

This Contract is funded 91% by Federal Housing and Urban Development Fund and 9% Housing Security Fund.

**BACKGROUND:**

In November 2018, the County Administrator approved and Purchasing Services Manager executed Contract #25-079-1 with Portia Bell Hume Behavioral Health and Training Center to provide case management and homelessness diversion counseling to County residents who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless for the period from October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019.
