This Contract is funded by 50% Federal Medi-Cal and 50% Employment and Human Services Department.



BACKGROUND: (CONT'D)

Approval of Novation Contract #74-586-1 will allow the Contractor to continue to provide mental health services through June 30, 2020.

CONSEQUENCE OF NEGATIVE ACTION:

If this contract is not approved, children and adolescents who are dependents of Contra Costa County will not have access to mental health services while placed out of County.

CHILDREN'S IMPACT STATEMENT:

This program supports two of the Board of Supervisors' five community outcomes: "Families that are Safe, Stable, and Nurturing"; and "Communities that are Safe and Provide a High Quality of Life for Children and Families". Expected program outcomes include an increase in positive social and emotional development as measured by the Child and Adolescent Functional Assessment Scale (CAFAS).
