# BACKGROUND: (CONT'D)

Department entered into a service contract with Telecare Corporation to provide residential crisis services at this location. The lease provides Telecare's occupancy of the County building to provide those services. In consideration for services rendered by Telecare, the County does not receive any rental income for the lease.

The Health Services Department intends to extend its service contract with Telecare for an additional year beginning July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020 and has requested that the lease with Telecare follow in the same manner.

## CONSEQUENCE OF NEGATIVE ACTION:

If the lease amendment is not approved, the Health Services Department may experience interruptions in its ability to provide residential crisis services to the surrounding communities.
