CHILDREN'S IMPACT STATEMENT:

The Pittsburg Library provides robust Children's programming that includes weekly story times, STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts and Mathematics) events and special performers. The Children's room is daily full of children and their families making use of the early literacy activities, computers and enjoying the book collection. The current shelving is the original from when the library was first built in the 1960's. The shelving is old, in ill repair, and not compliant with the Americans With Disabilities Act.
