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**RECOMMENDATION(S):**

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Health Services Director, or designee, to execute on behalf of the County Contract #25-079-3 with Portia Bell Hume Behavioral Health and Training Center, a non-profit corporation, in an amount not to exceed \$445,000, to provide case management and homelessness Rapid Resolution counseling to County residents who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless for the period from October 1, 2019 through June 30, 2021

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

This Contract is funded by 39% Federal Housing and Urban Development Fund, 56% Adult Protective Services Home Safe Program and 5% Housing Security. (No rate increase)

**BACKGROUND:**

In November 2018, the County Administrator approved and Purchasing Services Manager executed Contract #25-079-1, (as amended by Contract Amendment Agreement #25-079-2) with Portia Bell Hume Behavioral Health and Training Center to provide case management and homelessness
