Subject: Agreement for Services - Dept. of Parks and Recreation

RECOMMENDATION(S):

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Agricultural Commissioner, or designee, to execute an agreement with State of California - Department of Parks and Recreation in an amount not to exceed \$9,000 for the county to provide services to treat invasive weeds in Mount Diablo State Park beginning February 1, 2020 through June 30, 2020.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The county will be reimbursed in an amount not to exceed \$9,000 for providing supplies and labor to control invasive weeds in the Mount Diablo State Park. for State of California - Department of Parks and Recreation.

BACKGROUND:

Contra Costa County Agriculture Weights and Measures Department has a long history of weed management and weed abatement. There are two main non-native and invasive weeds (Artichoke Thistle and Purple Star Thistle) we continue to invest time and resources to abate as well as several other species. Contra Costa is generally infested with both Artichoke Thistle and Purple Star Thistle, which are both B rated pests, and both are a detriment to our precious range lands and our fragile regional and state parks. BACKGROUND: (CONT'D)
