Subject: Amendment #74-517-5 with Child Therapy Institute of Marin

RECOMMENDATION(S):

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Health Services Director, or designee, to execute on behalf of the County Contract Amendment Agreement #74-517-5 with Child Therapy Institute of Marin, a non-profit corporation, effective March 1, 2020, to amend Novation Contract #74-517-4, to increase the payment limit by \$21,812, from \$817,930 to a new payment limit of \$839,742, with no change in the original term of July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020, and to increase the automatic extension payment limit by \$32,717, from \$408,965 to a new payment limit of \$441,682 through December 31, 2020.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This amendment is funded by 50% Federal Medi-Cal and 50% Mental Health Realignment Funds. (Rate increase)

BACKGROUND:

This Contract meets the social needs of County's population by providing mental health services to adolescents with emotional and behavioral problems to improve school performance, reduce unsafe behavioral practices, and reduce the need for out-of-home placements.

On July 23, 2019, the Board of Supervisors approved Novation Contract #74-517-4 with Child Therapy Institute of Marin, for the provision of mental health services for Seriously Emotionally Disturbed children and adolescents in East and West county for the period from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020, which included a six-month automatic extension through December 31, 2020.

BACKGROUND: (CONT'D)

Approval of Amendment #74-517-5 will allow the Contractor to continue to provide mental health services, through June 30, 2020.

CONSEQUENCE OF NEGATIVE ACTION:

If this amendment is not approved, Contractor will not receive the negotiated rate increase.

CHILDREN'S IMPACT STATEMENT:
