RECOMMENDATION(S):

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Health Services Director, or designee, to execute on behalf of the County Contract Amendment Agreement #74-058-29 with Seneca Family of Agencies, a non-profit corporation, effective March 1, 2020, to amend Novation Contract #74-058-28, to increase the payment limit by \$238,171, from \$8,931,426 to a new payment limit of \$9,169,597, with no change in the original term of July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020, and to increase the automatic extension payment limit by \$322,914 from \$4,465,713 to a new payment limit of \$4,788,627, through December 31, 2020.

FISCAL IMPACT:


This Amendment is funded by 50% Federal Medi-Cal, 41% Mental Health Realignment, 4% School Districts and 5% Employment and Human Services Department. (Rate increase)

BACKGROUND:

On December 17, 2019, the Board of Supervisors approved Novation Contract #74-058-28 with Seneca Family of Agencies for the period from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020, which included a six-month automatic extension through December 31, 2020, for the provision of Mobile Crisis Response Teams for seriously emotionally disturbed (SED)
