Subject: Agreement #19-0737-005-SF ACP Winter Trapping

RECOMMENDATION(S):

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Agricultural Commissioner, or designee, to execute a contract with the California Department of Food and Agriculture to pay County in an amount not to exceed \$68,861 to provide Asian Citrus Psyllid Winter Trapping for the period October 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020. (100% State)

FISCAL IMPACT:

Approval of this agreement will reimburse the county for expenditures to provide services in an amount not to exceed \$68, 681. There is no county match of funds.

BACKGROUND:

The county shall provide services for placing and servicing Asian Citrus Psyllid traps for the period October 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020 in conjunction with exotic pest detection trapping services. This agreement includes delimitation work associated with the detection of one or more life stages of target pests in the county. Exotic insect pests are considered hazardous to agriculture and the economy of California. Payment will be reimbursed on authorized charges matching the financial plan (salaries, benefits, overhead supplies, vehicle mileage and vehicle leasing costs).
