BACKGROUND:

The District entered into an agreement with American Rivers on February 19, 2020 to implement the Three Creeks Parkway Restoration Project (Project), a multi-benefit flood management and ecosystem restoration project located along portions of Marsh Creek in the Brentwood

BACKGROUND: (CONT'D)

area from the Union Pacific Railroad crossing to Dainty Avenue. The Board approved the Project on November 12, 2019.

American Rivers has obtained grant funding to pay for a portion of the Project, including a grant from the State Coastal Conservancy (Conservancy). The Conservancy grant agreement requires that American Rivers enter into an Access Agreement with the District to protect the public interest by ensuring that American Rivers has permission to implement, monitor, and maintain the Project on District property. The Access Agreement terminates on January 31, 2042, and includes, among other requirements, that Conservancy funds not be used for mitigation of off-site environmental impacts unless written permission is obtained from the Conservancy, certification that there are no encumbrances on District property that would prevent Project implementation, and that after implementation, the District will maintain the Project long term in a manner consistent with the purposes of the Project. In addition, access by American Rivers to District property will be subject to terms and conditions of an encroachment permit to be issued by the District prior to the start of construction.

CONSEQUENCE OF NEGATIVE ACTION:

Without this action, the Access Agreement will not be approved.
