**RECOMMENDATION(S):**

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Employment and Human Services Director, or designee, to execute a contract with Child Abuse Prevention Council, a non-profit corporation, in an amount not to exceed \$1,358,693 to provide child abuse prevention services for the period July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

The funds allocated for this contract are 70% State 2011 Realignment (\$951,085) and 30% County General Fund (\$407,608).

**BACKGROUND:**

Child Abuse Prevention Council will direct and coordinate ongoing activities aimed at mobilizing community resources and educating professionals and citizens to reduce the incidents of child abuse.

**CONSEQUENCE OF NEGATIVE ACTION:**

Valuable services to prevent child abuse will not be provided.
