Subject: 2020-21 CA Department of Education Alternative Payment Childcare Services Revenue Contract

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**RECOMMENDATION(S):**

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Employment and Human Services Department Director, or designee, to execute a revenue agreement in the amount of \$3,665,811 from the California Department of Education for alternative payment childcare programs operated by the County, with the term July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

This agreement is funded by the California Department of Education and no County match is required. The State funding number is CAPP 0010; the County number is 29-212-37.

This contract is 58% (\$2,125,714) funded by Federal dollars passed through the State Department of Education [CFDA #93.596 and #93.575], and 42% (\$1,540,097) funded by the State.

**BACKGROUND:**

The Department was notified by the California Department of Education on June 2, 2020 of the County's 2020-21 allocation for the Alternative Payment childcare services program.

BACKGROUND: (CONT'D)

program provides funding for program eligible families to receive services.
