Subject: Contract #74-143-32 with California Psychiatric Transitions Incorporated

**RECOMMENDATION(S):**

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Health Services Director, or designee, to execute on behalf of the County Contract #74-143-32 containing mutual indemnification with California Psychiatric Transitions Incorporated, a corporation, in an amount not to exceed \$1,826,956, to provide adult residential care and mental health services for the period from September 1, 2020 through August 31, 2021.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

This Contract is funded 100% by Mental Health Realignment. (No rate increase)

**BACKGROUND:**

This Contract meets the social needs of County's population by providing a multi-disciplinary treatment program to adults who need active psychiatric treatment, including medication support and individual and group therapy services, as an alternative to hospitalization at a State Hospital. On August 6, 2019, the Board of Supervisors approved Contract #74-143-31 with California Psychiatric Transitions Incorporated for the period from July 1, 2019 through August 31, 2020 for the provision of residential care and mental health services to adults. Approval of Contract #74-143-32 will allow the Contractor to
