Subject: Contract for facility condition assessment of the County building portfolio and software

RECOMMENDATION(S):

AUTHORIZE the County Administrator or designee, to sign, subject to approval by the County Administrator and approval as to form by County Counsel, a software and services agreement for facility condition assessment of the County building portfolio and software to assist in capital planning activities for five years, in an amount not to exceed \$650,000, with Accruent, L.L.C.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The cost of the assessment and software will be \$650,000. (100% General Fund Capital Reserves)

BACKGROUND:

The County did a facilities condition assessment (FCA) in 2007 which was partially updated in 2014. Ideally, an FCA should be performed every approximately five years to assess the condition and amount of deferred maintenance in the building portfolio to guide capital facilities spending and planning in the coming years. Staff recommends a comprehensive FCA be performed in FY 20-21 to help prepare capital spending plans in the upcoming budget years and since it has been approximately seven years since the last update of the
