The Employment and Human Services Department, Area Agency on Aging provides Health Insurance Counseling and Advocacy (HICAP) services to Medicare beneficiaries including: 1) Medicare beneficiaries by virtue of a disability; 2) those persons imminent of Medicare eligibility as defined by Welfare and Institutions Code (W&I) sections 9541 (c)(2), and (3) to the public at large for HICAP community education under W&I Code sections 9541 (c)(1), (4), (5)and (6).
