Subject: Interagency Agreement with the Contra Costa County Office of Education for Academic Support Services

RECOMMENDATION(S):

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the County Probation Officer, or designee, to execute an Interagency Agreement with the Contra Costa County Office of Education, in an amount not to exceed \$413,618 to provide one-on-one academic support services for justice-involved or at-risk youths for the period July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022.

FISCAL IMPACT:

100% Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act (JJCPA) revenue.

BACKGROUND:

Over the past decade, researchers have identified intervention strategies and program models that reduce delinquency and promote pro-social development. Investing in successful prevention programs saves youths' lives by diverting youth from further encounters with the justice system. Under this contract, the Contra Costa County Office of Education (CCCOE) will provide three educational case managers, one for each area of the county (East, West, and Central) to address the needs of justice-involved youth. CCCOE recognizes the need for intensive education case management for justice-involved youth to help them successfully complete high school, encourage college and career pathway
