FISCAL IMPACT:

This contract will increase department expenditures by \$642,993 to be funded 73% with County General Funds and 27% Grant Funds.

BACKGROUND:

This contract is to ensure delivery of effective services for victims of interpersonal violence through a coordinated client-centered, multidisciplinary service model. Contra Costa Family Justice Alliance provides support and assistance to increase the safety and empowerment of families within the county experiencing interpersonal violence and to coordinate access to multiple service providers and achieve specific measured outcomes.
