\$1,117,872: This contract is entirely federally funded by Administration for Children and Families with CFDA No. 93.600. There are no County costs. (100% Federal)

BACKGROUND:

Contra Costa County receives funds from the Administration for Children and Families (ACF) to provide Head Start/Early Head Start and Early Head Start Childcare Partnership Program services to program eligible County residents. The Department, in turn, contracts with a number of community-based organizations to provide a wider distribution of services.
