RECOMMENDATION(S):

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Health Services Director, or designee, to execute on behalf of County Contract #74-476-7 with Consumer Self-Help Center, a non-profit corporation, in an amount not to exceed \$255,620, to provide a Patients' Rights Program, for the period July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Approval of this contract will result in budgeted expenditures of up to \$255,620 for FY 2021-2022 and will be funded 100% by Mental Health Realignment funds.

BACKGROUND:

The Behavioral Health Services Department has been contracting with Consumers Self-Help Center, since October 2014 to provide a State-mandated Patients' Rights Advocacy Program, including general advocacy and training services, Certification Review Hearing services, and Reise Capacity Hearing services.

On July 28, 2020, the Board of Supervisors approved Contract #74-476-6 with Consumers
