Subject: California Department of Aging, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program - Education Funding

RECOMMENDATION(S):

ADOPT Resolution No. 2021/274 to approve and authorize the Employment and Human Services Director, or designee, to accept funding in an amount not to exceed \$98,141 from the California Department of Aging to provide Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program-Education services for the period October 1, 2021 through September 30, 2022.

FISCAL IMPACT:

County to receive \$98,141 in 100% Federal funding from the California Department of Aging.

The County will retain the 10% maximum allowable portion of the grant totaling \$9,814.10 for administration.

No County match is required.

CFDA: 10.561

BACKGROUND:

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program-Education (SNAP-Ed) provides evidence-based nutrition education and obesity prevention services to seniors. The funding will be used for planning and service delivery to improve the health of low-income seniors
