Subject: Interagency Agreement with the Contra Costa County Office of Education

RECOMMENDATION(S):

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the County Probation Officer, or designee, to execute an Interagency Agreement with the Contra Costa County Office of Education, in an amount not to exceed \$615,500 to provide one-on-one academic support services for justice-involved youth or at risk of justice involvement for the period July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023.

FISCAL IMPACT:

100% Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act(JJCPA) Revenue.

BACKGROUND:

Under this agreement, Contra Costa Office of Education (CCCOE) will provide 3.0 Full time Equivalent (FTE) Case Managers, and 0.50 FTE Case Manager Supervisor, to provide one-on-one academic support services for justice-involved youth or at risk of involvement in the juvenile justice system, ages 14-17 years old that are attending schools in Contra Costa County. CCCOE recognizes the need for intensive education case management for justice-involved youth to help them successfully complete high school, encourage college and career pathway involvement and providing pro-social supports that help youth become thriving members of their community. Case managers will help prevent youth from
