Subject: 2022 DNA Capacity Enhancement for Backlog Reduction Program

### **RECOMMENDATION(S):**

ADOPT Resolution No. 2022/248 authorizing the Sheriff-Coroner, Undersheriff, or Commander Management Services, to apply for and accept the U.S. Department of Justice Programs, DNA Program Backlog Reduction Grant in an initial amount of \$347,033 to reduce the number of backlogged DNA tests in the Sheriff's Criminalistics Laboratory for the period of October 1, 2022, through the end of the grant period.

#### FISCAL IMPACT:

No County costs. Initial revenue: \$347,033, 100% Federal revenue, no County match required.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The Contra Costa County, Office of the Sheriff, Forensic Services Division operates an ANSI National Accredited Crime Laboratory to provide County-wide Forensic DNA testing services. The DNA backlog reduction grant funds are needed to ensure the efficient processing of DNA evidence. Grant funds have been used in the past to purchase scientific equipment allowing for high throughput DNA extraction, quantification and detection. In addition, funding supported DNA analyst positions whom process DNA samples collected

The 2022 DNA Capacity Enhancement for Backlog Reduction Program Grant will be used to support DNA analysts, acquire advanced technology, and provide state-of the art forensic DNA testing to law enforcement agencies in the Contra Costa County.

## **CONSEQUENCE OF NEGATIVE ACTION:**

A decision not to pursue grant funding will increase the DNA case backlog, increase the turnaround time for DNA sample processing, and contribute to delays in criminal prosecutions.
