RECOMMENDATION(S):

ADOPT Position Adjustment Resolution No. 26075 to add one (1) Assessor's Local Exemptions Specialist (JWSR) (represented) position at salary plan and grade 3RX-1233 (\$4,810.68 - \$6,143.43), and cancel one (1) vacant Clerk-Specialist Level (JWXD) (represented) position number 18813 salary plan 3RX-1156 (\$4,457.54 - \$5,692.46) in the Assessor's Office.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The salary and benefit cost increase will be approximately \$6,696.00 annually and \$3,906.00 in this fiscal year. The annual increase includes an cost of \$974 attributable to retirement. The increase will be be absorbed in the current budget (100% General Fund).

BACKGROUND:

Assessor's Local Exemptions Specialist is a single position classification in the Local Exemptions Division of the Assessor's Office. The Assessor's Local Exemptions Specialist evaluates and processes claims for local property tax exemption, including on-site inspection of properties, and provides lead direction to clerical workers engaged in records
