RECOMMENDATION(S):

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Health Services Director, or designee, to execute on behalf of the County Contract #26-700-16 with Jaison James, M.D., an individual, in an amount not to exceed \$1,200,000, to provide orthopedic services for Contra Costa Regional Medical Center (CCRMC) and Contra Costa Health Center patients, for the period February 1, 2023 through January 31, 2026.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Approval of this contract will result in contractual service expenditures of up to \$1,200,000 over a 3-year period and will be funded 100% by Hospital Enterprise Fund I revenues. (Rate increase)

BACKGROUND:

Due to the limited number of specialty providers available within the community, CCRMC and Contra Costa Health Centers relies on contracts to provide necessary specialty health services to its patients. CCRMC has contracted with Dr. James for orthopedic specialty services since August 2011.
