RECOMMENDATION(S):

APPROVE and AUTHORIZE the Employment & Human Services Director, or designee, to execute a contract amendment with the California Department of Education to amend the minimum days of operation to 244 days for general childcare and development program services with no change to the payment limit of \$2,792,455 or term July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011.
