### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

This Contract is funded from 100% Mental Health Realignment funds. (No rate increase)

#### **BACKGROUND:**

For a number of years the County has contracted with Medical, Dental and Mental Health Specialists to provide specialized professional services, which are not otherwise available in its Hospital and Health Centers.

On December 15, 2009, the Board of Supervisors approved Contract #74-343-1 with Richard D. Baldwin, M.D. to provide geriatric psychiatric services for seriously and persistently mentally ill older adults at the County's
