Subject: Novation Interagency Agreement #74-373-2 with Martinez Unified School District

RECOMMENDATION(S):

Approve and authorize the Health Services Director, or his designee, to execute, on behalf of the County, Novation Interagency Agreement #74–373–2 with Martinez Unified School District, a government agency, in an amount not to exceed \$170,080, to provide Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) prevention and early intervention services for the period from July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012. This Agreement includes a six-month automatic extension through December 31, 2012, in an amount not to exceed \$85,040.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This Contract is funded 100% by State Mental Health Services Act (Proposition 63). No County funds are required.

BACKGROUND:

This Agreement meets the social needs of County's population by providing "career academies" which will include individualized learning plans, place-based learning projects and career mentorships and internships for 48 high school adolescent youths in Martinez of all cultural backgrounds.

BACKGROUND: (CONT'D)

of Supervisors approved Interagency Agreement #74–373-1 with Martinez Unified School District, for the period from July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011, which included a six-month automatic extension through December 31, 2011, for the provision of MHSA prevention and early intervention services.

Approval of Novation Interagency Agreement #74–373–2 replaces the automatic extension under the prior Agreement and allows Agency to continue providing services through June 30, 2012.

CONSEQUENCE OF NEGATIVE ACTION:

If this agreement is not approved, Agency will not pay County for Mental Health Services Act prevention and early intervention services.
