RECOMMENDATION(S):

Approve and authorize the Health Services Director, or his designee, to execute, on behalf of the County, Novation Contract #74–320–6 with The West Contra Costa Youth Service Bureau, a non-profit corporation, in an amount not to exceed \$475,381, to provide school-based mental health services to Seriously Emotionally Disturbed (SED) students in West County, for the period from July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012. This contract includes a six-month automatic extension through December 31, 2012 in an amount not to exceed \$237,690.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This Contract is funded 50% by Federal Medi-Cal (FFP) and 50% by State Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (EPSDT).

BACKGROUND: (CONT'D)

Board of Supervisors approved Contract #74–320-5 with The West Contra Costa Youth Service Bureau, for the period from July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011, which included a six-month automatic extension though December 31, 2011, for the provision of school-based mental health services to SED students in West County.

Approval of Novation Contract #74 320–6 replaces the automatic extension under the prior Contract and allows the Contractor to continue providing services through June 30, 2012.

CONSEQUENCE OF NEGATIVE ACTION:

If this contract is not approved, fewer school-based mental health services will be provided to SED students in West County as the Department solicits and engages an alternative contractor.
